This will run all year long. Every month, 20 young girls from primary 6 to JS3 or even up to SS2 will be taught the basic use of the computer. **To sponsor a child costs \$20.00.**

This targets indigent youths aged 17 –25 who will be trained in higher computer skills to enable them participate in a virtual participatory environment. They will be required to log onto the virtual village square and engage in academic and life
